RECENTLY DISCOVERED ERRATUM

In Figure 2 of Snyder (2002. Pallid and Shovelnose sturgeon larvae—morphological description and identification. Journal of Applied Ichthyology 18:240-265), the drawings of recently hatched Pallid and Shovelnose sturgeon were mistakenly transposed when the figure was divided and continued on the next page. The larva illustrated above the legend on page 253 is of the Shovelnose Sturgeon (not Pallid Sturgeon as indicated in the legend) and was the lower of the two three-view drawings in the original figure; correspondingly, the larva illustrated, and continuing Figure 2, on page 254 is of the Pallid Sturgeon and was the upper of the two drawings in the original figure. I apologize for having overlooked the error when I reviewed the pre-publication proof and for not catching and reporting the error sooner.

Also, the article is based in part on additional data referenced and archived in LarvalBase (www.larvalbase.org/Snyder 2002/).
